Law Enforcement Safety Act of 2004 and LEOSA Improvement Act of 2010 Law Enforcement Retiree Qualification System

PROCESS:

- Upon request, the retiree will be furnished with a LEOSA Information package provided by the local sheriff's office.
- Retiree determines if he/she meets the criteria of being "Honorably Retired" from law enforcement as set forth in LEOSA.
- Retiree selects a shooting range to attend from a law enforcement agency or from a list of those that have been Sheriff-approved pursuant to NRS 202.3657 (CCW).
- In the presence of an instructor, the retiree shoots for a qualification score, (passing score proposed at 70%).
- The instructor and retiree complete the "Retirement Qualification & Waiver Form", developed by the NvSCA and used statewide.
- Retiree brings the completed form to the county sheriff's office of the county in which he/she resides along with the confirming letter of qualification from the retiree's agency.
- The Concealed Weapon Permit detail of the county sheriff's office will conduct a background check on the retiree.
- The Concealed Weapon Permit detail of the county sheriff's office will maintain "Retirement Qualification & Waiver Form" forms for future reference.
- If the retiree has satisfactorily met all requirements, the Concealed Weapon Permit detail of the county sheriff's office will issue the retiree a qualification card stating that he/she has met the qualification requirements set forth in LEOSA.
- The retiree will maintain the qualification card anytime he/she is carrying a concealed firearm.
- If the retiree has *not* satisfactorily met all requirements, the Concealed Weapon Permit detail of the county sheriff's office will issue the retiree the denial form putting a check mark by the reason(s) for not issuing the "Retirement Qualification & Waiver Form".
